Advanced Placement:

- 136 seniors, representing 61.26% of the class of 2023, completed at least one AP course in their high school career.
- 109 seniors (49% of the class) took 2 or more and 88 seniors (39.6% of the class) took 3 or more AP courses.
- A total of 675 AP exams were administered in 2023.
- The average score on all exams was 3.3, and 74% of all scores were 3 or higher.

College Level Courses:

- 186 students (84% of the class) took at least one CL course in their HS career.
- 173 students (78% of the class) took at least 2 CL courses.
- 150 students (75% of the class) took at least 3 CL courses.

Diploma Designations:
